


# What do we know about Gippsland's Family Violence Statistics?

## Gippsland



**9,444**

Total Incidents in Gippsland. A family incident is the number of reports submitted by Vic Pol and recorded into LEAP. **The total number of incidents include:**



781 Cases of family violence serious assault



1,311 Cases of family violence common assault



3,084 breaches of a family violence order.



Family Violence costs Gippsland \$320m annually (KMPG Modeling)



231 Incidents of family violence threatening behaviour.



140 incidents of family violence stalking



60 Incidents of family violence harassment and private nuisance

Family Violence incidents do not include the 918 sexual offences that occurred in Gippsland, although some charges may be co-occurring

Not all family violence incidents will be reported to Victoria Police. Data does not include people who independently make contact with support services, are referred from third parties or who do not report.

## Bass Coast

# South Gippsland

50 Cases of family violence serious assault  
71 Cases of family violence common assault



-12% decrease in incidents, compared to the previous year.

174 breaches of a family violence order.

**33rd** in the state for family violence police incidents (per 100,000 population)

# Latrobe



Total population: 80,524  
(2024, Community ID)



248 Cases of family violence serious assault  
405 Cases of family violence common assault



-4.3% decrease in incidents, compared to the previous year.

**2980** total incidents, these incidents include:



1055 breaches of a family violence order.

**2nd** in the state for family violence incidents (per 100,000 population)

Latrobe is second in the state for family violence incidents when controlled for 100,000 of the population. But is 10<sup>th</sup> in the state overall for total incidents. Latrobe is number three in the state for regional areas, behind Geelong and Ballarat.
