

Family Violence is at Crisis Point in Gippsland.

Family Violence is deeply connected to the broader social, economic and structural conditions experienced by people across Gippsland. Housing insecurity, poverty, unemployment, limited access to services, social isolation, disability, health inequities and geographic disadvantage can increase vulnerability to family violence, while experiencing family violence can in turn make it significantly harder for people to secure safe housing, maintain employment, access education, participate in community life and achieve financial security.

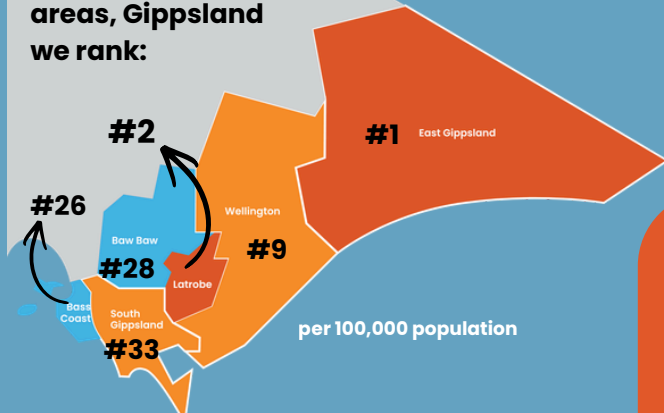

Specialist family violence services generate on average **\$79,500** in benefits per client, through improved health, increased workforce participation, reduced property damage and better outcomes for children.

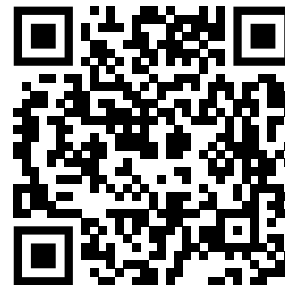
Every \$1 spent on specialist family violence services delivers around \$6 in social and economic benefit
